

Monday “God’s Epic Story”

Main Idea: We have messed up, but God can fix it.

Read Genesis 1:3-5

What did God create on the first day and what did God say about it?

Read Genesis 1:6-8

What did God create on the second day?

Read Genesis 1:9-13

What did God create on the third day and what did God say about it?

Read Genesis 1:14-19

What did God create on the fourth day and what did God say about it?

Read Genesis 1:20-23

What did God create on the fifth day and what did God say about it?

Read Genesis 1:24-25

What did God create on the sixth day and what did God say about it?

Read Genesis 1:26-31

What else did God create on the sixth day and what did God say about it?

Read Genesis 2:1-3

What did God do on the seventh day and what did God say about it?

Then what happened? Tell the story of the tree in the garden.

Did Adam and Eve obey God?

The Bible says that just like Adam and Eve, we don't obey all of the time either. Read Romans 3:23. We all know that when we disobey there are consequences. What does Romans 6:23 say is the consequence of sin?

What does Romans 6:23 say that God really wants to give us even though we disobey?

Tuesday “God’s Epic Arrival”

Main Idea: God sent Jesus to deal with our mess

Tell what you remember from the Christmas story together as a cabin.

Read Luke 2:1-20

Are there any differences between what you remembered and what you just read?

What was the good news that the angels had for the shepherds? (vs. 11)

What does the word savior mean?

Why was Jesus called the savior?

How did the shepherds respond to the news according to vs. 15-16?

How did the shepherds respond to the news according to vs. 17-18?

How did the shepherds respond to the news according to vs. 20?

You can respond to this good news the same way the shepherds did:

Where can you go to see Jesus today?

Who can you tell about Jesus?

How can you give glory and praise to God?
